UPCOMING SUMMER CAMP GRAHAM LEWIS. DIRECTOR SAPELO HAMMOCK GOLF ACADEMY:

The summer junior golf camps are back this year. After a year with no junior camps due to Covid 19, the Sapelo Hammock Golf Academy is ready to welcome our youth to come and enjoy learning and playing golf at one or both of the summer camps. The camps are four half day sessions on June 7-10 and July 26-29. Due to remaining attention to Covid precautions, each camp will be limited to 25 kids from the ages of 6-16.

Since 2010 the Academy has seen more than 350 young golfers participate. Each camp has grown from as few as 6 in the first year to as many as 30 in 2019. This year we will again have our same instructors supervising and teaching the kids who will be divided into groups based on age and ability. Our instructors include: Graham Lewis (Academy Director and a Certified United States Golf Teachers Federation teacher); Mark Harman (Certified Master teacher with the USGTF who teaches at Southbridge and the PGA Super Store in Bluffton, South Carolina); Ron Smith (McIntosh Academy golf coach); and Megan Shinske (U of Mississippi golfer).

Parents and relatives are welcomed to watch their kids participate in camp activities and on the last day they can drive the carts and watch as the kids play nine holes on the course. The cost is \$150 per child and \$225 for two in the same family. Lunch and water will be provided each day and an awards ceremony will be held after play on the last day of each camp.

Report from Chris Hankey, Director of Course Operations

Special Note: The following report was written prior to the severe storm that hit Shellman Bluff on April 24th. The impact was significant but an extraordinary effort by staff and volunteers brought the course back into good shape and we became fully operational again on April 29th.

Could warm weather actually be here? As is typical, an early green-up has been followed by colder weather-hot one day, cold the next. Along with the below average temperatures came a flush of late season winter weeds. I was pleased with the success of our weed control program this past fall and winter. The course remained virtually weed free. What I did not expect was the loss of turf on some greens after a winter that saw the most frost delays and coldest consistent temperatures we have had in the last ten years.

The board approved tree removals around the greens on holes 1, 6, and 9. These are the greens most impacted by shade. The work has been completed and you will see improvement in these greens, especially during next year's spring transition. No one likes removing trees on our beautiful course but it had to be done.

The month of May is when we usually turn the corner and the course greens begin to grow. We have a course wide fertilization scheduled for May 7th. Hopefully we will experience normal temperatures and the season will begin on time. The biggest improvement we will see will come from hot weather. Any weeds currently visible on the course are all winter annuals and will die out when temperatures increase. Every effort is being made to regrow turf on the damaged greens. Patience is needed during this process. We will see major improvements in the coming weeks.

Thanks to the board and our volunteers for your support and help with course improvement.

The Pavilion at Sapelo Hammock in Honor of Martin NeSmith

As you all know, Martin NeSmith played an incredibly important role in the success of our golf club through his hard work and dedication, financial contributions, and sponsorship of tournaments.

In Martin's memory, a special fund has been established to construct a pavilion behind the clubhouse overlooking the marsh on the exact spot where his memorial service was held last fall. This will be an 18ft by 14ft structure with six white columns and will contain a seating area, internet service and electricity. It will hold a special plaque commemorating Martin with the theme of "He will always be missed but never forgotten". The pavilion will be used for all types of special events, including weddings and ceremonies. A special dedication ceremony will be held on May 14^{th} , so please mark your calendar.

By the way, Martin was recently honored with a resolution by the Georgia General Assembly in tribute to his business acumen and service to others over his lifetime. In the same way that he served his local community and Sapelo Hammock, he did the same for Georgians all across the state. The following pages has the full text of the resolution:

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the life and memory of Martin Walton NeSmith; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 3 with the passing of Martin Walton NeSmith on November 17, 2020; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Martin Walton NeSmith was born on November 1, 1948, in Nevils, Georgia;
- 5 and 6 WHEREAS, he served as a guardian of this nation's freedom and liberty with the United
- 7 States National Guard and later began his distinguished career in the automotive industry,
- 8 working with Siefert Equipment and, at the age of 24, becoming the youngest dealer in the
- 9 nation after purchasing a Chevrolet dealership; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Martin conducted his business with grace, integrity, and geniality,
- 11 revolutionizing the car industry with his No Hassle Buying policy and exemplifying his
- 12 mission to ensure that customers were always treated as honored guests; and
- 13 WHEREAS, as a result of his dedication to excellence, he was bestowed the prestigious
- 14 TIME Magazine Quality Dealer of the Year Award in 2001, and with 61 dealers nominated H. R. 458 1 LC 122 0255
- 15 out of 20,500 dealers nationwide, was selected as their National Winner, and the 2008
- 16 General Motor Dealer of the Year Award; and
- 17 WHEREAS, he was a philanthropist at heart who contributed to innumerable causes,
- 18 including the United Way, Red Cross, and local recreation departments; served on many
- 19 boards, such as the Chairman of the Board of the Georgia Automobile Dealers Association
- 20 from 1993 to 1994; the National Automobile Dealers Association Board from 2001 to 2008;
- 21 the Board of Regents from 1999 to 2006; and Chairman of Coastal Conservation Association
- 22 of Georgia in 2000; and joined together with partners to build a local medical clinic in
- 23 Shellman Bluff; and

24 WHEREAS, a man of deep and abiding faith who witnessed Christ through word and deed,
25 Martin was an active member of First Baptist Church in Claxton for many years and
26 Shellmen Bluff Baptist Church; and
27 WHEREAS, he was united in love and marriage to his wife, Suzette, and was blessed with
28 two remarkable children, Demere and Chad, as well as five outstanding grandchildren; and
29 WHEREAS, a compassionate and generous man, Martin Walton NeSmith will long be
30 remembered for his love of family, friendship, and community and will be missed by all who
31 had the great fortune of knowing him.

Sapelo Hammock Hosts Its Largest Tournament Ever

Sapelo Hammock is extremely proud of its role in hosting the 2nd Annual Veteran Carriers Trucking For a Cause Golf Tournament on April 23rd. This was the largest tournament that we have ever hosted (144 players) and the event was a resounding success. It was a perfect weather day with temps in the lower 70s, brilliant sunshine, and a gentle breeze. The fun filled scramble took about six hours and was followed by an enthusiastic live auction where one charity minded supporter bid a whopping \$2500 for a cake! That was an indication of the type of bidding that other high value items brought during the auction. The goal was to raise over \$50,000 in support of the TACP Foundation.

Cliff White, a resident of Sutherland Bluff Plantation, played the key role in acquiring this tournament for our club. Cliff co-owns (along with Rob Cooch) Veteran Carriers, a trucking firm based in Savannah. He served in the special forces and was deployed multiple times during his military career. He has personally known many families who have lost loved ones in global conflicts - the source of his interest and his dedication to the TACP Foundation.

The foundation serves the TACP (Tactical Air Control Party) community by memorializing the fallen, inspiring young TACPs and providing support for the families that have lost a TACP due to combat, training or tragedy. As members of Air Force Special Warfare, TACP specialists imbed with Army and Marine units on the frontline with the responsibility of calling in air strikes on the right target at just the right time. These highly trained experts go through intense physical, mental and technical training in order to withstand the demanding conditions of battle.
